Sample Study Questions

Before taking the NJ written (Permit) test it is essential that you first study thoroughly the latest official NJ MVC (DMV) guidebook. Although you may already know the answers to some of the more common questions, the test is made up of many detailed questions involving exact measurements and distances, fines and penalties etc. In addition to studying the DMV guide, as a practice NJ DMV test, we have compiled a list of over 150 sample questions and answers for the NJ DMV written permit test. These online sample NJ dmv (written permit) test study questions should only be looked at AFTER you have read through the MVC (DMV) booklet. These New Jersey written permit sample test questions are meant to gauge your knowledge of the materials in the booklet, not replace the booklet itself. Good luck!
